The 1982 Men's Championship

Every two years golfers from those countries of the world that play the game have met to reaffirm that golf has values beyond the normal drive to satisfy competitive instincts. The game is, of itself, a means of drawing different peoples together.

While the United States won both the World Amateur Team Championship for the Eisenhower Trophy and the Women's World Amateur Team Championship for the Espirito Santo Trophy, it was more significant that so many countries found in golf a common ground for the exercise of friendly competition. Representatives from 32 countries began play in the men's and 26 in the women's championships.

At the same time, it was unfortunate that

politics has so intruded into the championships that only 30 teams completed the men's championship. Two teams withdrew under instructions from their governments and neither Canada nor Australia entered.

Although intrusion of politics is a cause of deep concern within the World Amateur Golf Council, it is encouraging, nonetheless, that so many countries sent representatives to the championships without regard to their political convictions.

At the closing ceremonies, William C. Campbell, President of the United States Golf Association and Joint Chairman of the World Amateur Golf Council, expressed his concern.

the Council's objective and, therefore, the council itself. A worrisome symptom is that, among others, two prominent golfing countries did not send teams here, and some countries have been represented only because of the determination, and even courage of their golf officials, team captains, and members. We hope that in the future no team will be kept from or be taken out of competition by its own government. The Council can not long endure if our game is habitually politicized—if golf is exploited as a tool of national politics."

The men's championship was played at the Golf Club of Lausanne, in Lausanne, Switzerland, and the women's championship was played at the Golf Club of Geneva.

In winning its ninth men's championship (the competition has been played 13 times), the United States led every round and retained the Eisenhower Trophy with a score of 859, seven strokes under Japan and Sweden, which tied for second place, at 866. France was fourth, at 874, followed by the Republic of China, at 878.

After the first round the United States led by two strokes on rounds of 69 by Jay Sigel, 70 by Jim Holtgrieve, and 73 by Nathaniel Crosby, for a total of 212. Japan was second, at 214, and Spain was third, at 217.

Sigel shot another 69 in the second round, and both Holtgrieve and Bob Lewis shot 73s.

At the end of the day the United States still led Japan by two strokes, 427-429. By then Sweden had moved into third place, at 435, behind a 70 by Krister Kinell, 71 by Magnus Persson, and 73 by Ove Sellberg. Their 214 was the second lowest team score of the day, behind the 212 by the Republic of China. Yuan Ching-chi shot 67, the best 18-hole score of the championship, Lin Chi-hsiang shot 69, and Li Wen-sheng shot 76.

The three leaders remained in the same positions throughout the remainder of the championship. After three rounds the United States was four strokes ahead, despite a shaky 221, and the Americans' position was saved only because the other teams had problems,

Led by a 68 by Nathaniel Crosby, the United States shot 211 in the fourth round, the lowest team total of the championship, Lewis shot 70, with 33 on the second nine, and Holtgrieve had 73. Holtgrieve was the only American player whose score counted each day.

This is a team championship and individual scores have no standing, other than their effect on the team's position. Nevertheless, it should be noted that Luis Carbonetti, of Argentina, shot 69-69-74-72—284, the best 72-hole score of the four days. He was a stroke better than Jay Sigel, of the United

States.

Delegates and Duffers Cup

Frank D. Tatum, Jr., of the United States, won the men's division of the Delegates and Duffers Cup competition, and Lally Segard, of France, won the women's division. The Delegates and Duffers Cup is a handicap competition for delegates to the meetings of the World Amateur Golf Council and for non-playing captains of teams competing in the championships.

Tatum, who plays to a 3 handicap, shot 149 for 36 holes and had a net score of 143. He finished three strokes ahead of Seymour Marvin, of Brazil, with net 146. Tatum's 143 was also the lowest gross score.

Mrs. Segard won the women's division with 78-6-72. Louise van den Berghe, of Belgium, was second with 83-5-78. Mrs. Segard's 78 was also the low gross score.

After scoring 69s in the first two rounds, Jay Sigel finished with 73 and 74 and 285 for the four rounds. His individual total was one stroke more than Luis Carbonetti, of Argentina.







The 1982 Women's Championship

In winning the Women's World Amateur Team Championship for the 10th time, the United States set one record and tied another, leading every round at the Golf Club of Geneva.

Its score of 579 for the four days was a stroke better than the 580 the United States shot in 1966, and it won by 17 strokes over New Zealand, which finished with 596, tying the record set by the United States in 1976.

Shooting 73 and 75, respectively, Juli Inkster and Cathy Baker combined for 148 and gave the United States a five-stroke lead over Switzerland, with 153, after the first

round. Spain was third, at 154.

The next day Miss Baker and Miss Amy Benz both shot 72, giving the United States 144 for the day and 292 for the two rounds. Sweden moved into second place, with 297, on 70 by Liselotte Neumann and 70 by Hillewi Hagstrom. Jane Connachan shot 70 and helped Great Britain and Ireland take third place, at 299.

The third round ended with the United States again leading by five strokes. Mrs. Inkster shot 71 and Miss Benz 75, for 146 and 438 for 54 holes. Great Britain and Ireland, with Miss Connachan and Belle Robertson

each shooting 72, had 443.

The United States had its best day in the fourth round when Mrs. Inkster shot 70 and Miss Baker 71 for a daily score of 141, setting the four-day record at 579. New Zealand moved into second place with a final round of 143, behind 70 by Liz Douglas and 73 by Janice Arnold. It gave New Zealand a 72-hole score of 596. Great Britain and Ireland fell into third place, with 598.

Mrs. Inkster had rounds of 73-76-71-70, the lowest individual 72-hole total.

Mrs. Juli Inkster had a successful year in 1982. In addition to winning her third consecutive United States Women's Amateur Championship, she led the U.S. to a victory in the Curtis Cup Match and shot 73-76-71-70—290, not only helping the United States to win the Women's Championship, but also shooting the lowest individual score.

ARTICLES

OF THE WORLD AMATEUR GOLF COUNCIL

Adopted May 2, 1958. Revised: October 7, 1958; October 6, 1964; October 26, 1966; October 8, 1968; September 22, 1970; October 29, 1974; October 12, 1976; October 17, 1978.

ARTICLE I

The name of this council is THE WORLD AMA-TEUR GOLF COUNCIL.

ARTICLE II

Object

Section 1. Friendship and Sportsmanship through Golf

The object of the Council is to foster friendship and sportsmanship among the peoples of the world through the conduct biennially of an Amateur Team Championship for the Eisenhower Trophy.

Section 2. Rules of Golf

The Championship shall be conducted in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, and The United States Golf Association; however, if those organizations should have differing codes, the code of the host country shall apply.

ARTICLE III

Membership

Section 1. Eligibility

Membership in the Council is open to any organization which:

- (a) Constitutes the sole central authority for amateur golf in its country; and
- (b) Has adopted and administers the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, or The United States Golf Association.

Section 2. Election

An application for membership shall be supported by copies of the applicant's constitution and by-laws or similar documents and such other data as the Administrative Committee determines.

An applicant may be elected to Membership by the Council after determination by the Administrative Committee that the requirements for membership have been met.

Section 3. Finances

(a) Member Organizations shall pay annual dues of \$50, payable in January of each year in the currency of the Secretary's country unless prohibited by law or government regulation. Income from dues shall be used to defray all Council expenses relating to men's events. If expenses in a given year result in a deficit in the Council's account, which shall be located in the Secretary's country, the deficit shall be shared by those Member Organizations participating in the men's event held that year.

Expenses of the Council shall be limited to the following:

- (1) Insurance and maintenance of the Championship trophies:
- (2) Provision of prizes for individuals:
- (3) Cost of stationery, postage, printing and other communications incurred by the Secretary of the Council.

Income shall be limited to dues and monies accumulated to eliminate a deficit.

No Member Organization may incur any expense for the Council, and no representative of the Council shall have authority to incur any expense except as expressly stated herein.

- (b) Any other expense incident to the affairs of the Council shall be borne by the Member Organization whose representative incurs such expense.
- (c) The expense of conducting the Championship shall be borne by the Member Organization entertaining it.

Section 4. Obligations and Discipline

The acceptance of membership in the Council shall bind each Member Organization to uphold all the provisions of these Articles and any rules or actions of the Council or the Administrative Committee.

Any member Organization failing in these obligations or ceasing to meet the eligibility requirements may be suspended or expelled by the Council.

Section 5. Correspondence with Member Organizations

A Member Organization shall not circulate a memorandum to all other Member Organizations without approval of the Administrative Committee.

Section 6. Withdrawal

Any Member Organization may withdraw from membership by notifying the Secretary to that effect.

Any Member Organization so withdrawing shall remain obligated for its annual dues for the year in which withdrawal occurred.

ARTICLE IV

Championship

Section 1. Time

The Championship shall be held biennially, starting in 1958, on such dates as the Council shall determine. Normally, the Championship shall be held in the second or third week of October.

Section 2. Place

(a) The Championship shall be rotated among the three following zones in the order stated;

- (1) Australasian Zone Countries of Asia, Australia, New Zealand and Oceania.
- (2) American Zone Countries of North America, Caribbean America and South America.
- (3) European-African Zone Countries of Europe, Africa and the Middle East.
- (b) Invitations to entertain the Championship shall be submitted by Member Organizations to the Secretary at least three months in advance of the Biennial Meeting immediately preceding. The Secretary shall inform all Member Organizations of such invitations at least one month in advance of the Meeting.

(Note: Invitations may be submitted by any Member Organization in any zone. Although invitations from the appropriate zone will, of course, be given first consideration, it is important that invitations from other zones, particularly the zone next in order, should be available in case no invitation acceptable to the Council has been received from the appropriate zone.)

At the time of submitting its invitation the Member Organization shall represent that, subject to any restrictions imposed upon it by the Government of its country, it will allow all other Member Organizations to compete if its invitation is accepted. It shall also present with its invitation a statement from a properly authorized official of the Government of its country that all Member Organizations, other than those (if any) named in the statement, will be allowed to visit the country and to compete in the Championship without any restriction whatsoever.

At a time not more than eight months and not less than seven months from the first of the month in which the Championship is to take place, both the Member Organization and a properly authorized official of the Government of its country shall reiterate the statement made in the paragraph above.

Championship invitations shall not be issued and pertinent advertising/promotion shall not be engaged in more than 3½ years in advance.

- (c) The location of each Championship shall normally be determined by the Council at its Biennial Meeting immediately preceding. In reaching its decision the Council shall have regard to:
 - (i) the importance of locating the Championship in the appropriate zone in accordance with Section 2(a) of this Article;
 - (ii) the desirability of distributing the location of the Championship fairly among the Member Organizations in each zone; and
- (iii) the degree (if any) to which an invitation to entertain the Championship has been restricted by the Government of the country concerned.

If no invitation acceptable to the Council has been received from within the appropriate zone, the Council may consider and accept any invitation which may have been received from within the zone next in order of rotation.

However, if the Council at its Biennial Meeting is unable, due to a lack of acceptable invitations or for any other reason, finally to decide the location of the next Championship, the Administrative Committee shall take such steps as are necessary to ensure the continuance of the Championship.

(d) The Council shall have the power to waive the annual dues of any Member Organization which, owing to a restriction imposed by the Government of the country in which a particular Championship is being held, has not been invited to participate in that Championship.

ARTICLE V

Amateur Team Championship

Section 1. Entry Dates

Each Member Organization shall inform the Secretary biennially as to whether or not it will enter the Championship; such notification shall reach the Secretary not later than three months before the Championship. Later entries may be accepted if the Member Organization entertaining the Championship approves.

Each member Organization which enters the Championship shall inform the Secretary of the personnel of its Team not later than one month before the Championship. Substitutions may be made at any subsequent time at the pleasure of the Member Organization.

Section 2. Qualification of Players; Amateur Status

The players comprising each Team shall be:

- (a) Amateur golfers under the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews or The United States Golf Association; and
- (b) Citizens of the country of the Member Organization represented, except that in cases where a Team of citizens would be impracticable, players normally resident in the country may be included.

Each Team shall have a captain, who may be either a player or a non-player.

Section 3. Form of Play

- (a) Each Team shall consist of three or four players
- (b) The Championship shall consist of 72 holes stroke play; 18 holes each on four consecutive days of the Championship period. All the players of each team shall be eligible for all four rounds; disqualification of a player under the Rules of Golf in any round shall not be effective for any subsequent round unless the Administrative Committee determines otherwise.

In each 18-hole round, the total of the three lowest scores by players of each Team shall constitute the Team score for that round.

The total of the three-player Team scores for the four rounds shall be the Team's score for the Championship.

The Champion shall be the Team with the lowest such total score for 72 holes.

(c) If a tie for the Championship occurs, the

Teams concerned shall play off at 18 holes stroke play, the exact day to be determined in advance by the Member Organization entertaining the Championship. The Team with the lowest total score by three players shall win the play-off. Should an 18-hole play-off result in a further tie, the Teams so tied shall immediately continue to play off hole by hole until the winner is determined; the total of the three lowest scores will be the Team score for each hole.

Section 4. Prizes

- (a) The Eisenhower Trophy, presented to the Council by friends of golf in the United States through The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association, shall be held for the ensuing biennium by the Member Organization whose Team is the winner.
- (b) A uniform type of prize for individuals shall be awarded to the players and the Captain of the winning Team, the second-place Team and the thirdplace Team.
- (c) No other prizes may be accepted from any source, except symbolic gifts by a Member Organization to its Team.

Section 5. Championship Committee; Course Unplayable

- (a) Prior to a Championship, the Administrative Committee shall appoint a Championship Committee to conduct the event. The host Member Organization shall be represented on the Championship Committee.
- (b) The Championship Committee shall be authorized to decide when a Championship course in unplayable.
- (c) If a Championship course is declared unplayable and as a result it is not possible to complete 72 holes of play in the period in which the Championship is scheduled, the Championship shall not be extended beyond the last scheduled day and the winner shall be the Team which returns the lowest score for the number of stipulated rounds played, except that, if it is not possible to play at least 36 holes in the four scheduled days, the Championship shall be terminated without a champion being determined.
- (d) The Championship Committee shall be authorized to schedule in advance a round of less than 18 holes, i.e., the Committee shall be authorized to declare before play begins on any day that the stipulated round for that day shall be, for example, nine holes; the Committee shall not be authorized to declare during play of a round that the stipulated round for that day shall be, for example, nine holes if the stipulated round when play began was to be 18 holes.

ARTICLE VI

Arrangements for Championship

The Member Organization entertaining the Championship shall have the honor of and be responsible for planning and arranging for the Championship, subject to the applicable provisions of these Articles and approval by the Administrative Committee, and for all the expenses in connection therewith except

the expenses of the Teams. Such Member Organization may charge admission to spectators and otherwise raise income as it may desire, and any excess of the proceeds over the expenses shall be disposed of as the Council may determine.

No financial liability shall attach to either the Council or to any Member Organization other than the Member Organization entertaining the Championship.

ARTICLE VII

Expenses of Teams

Each Member Organization shall be responsible for the expenses of its Team's players and Captain.

ARTICLE VIII

Council Meetings

Section 1. Biennial Meeting

The Council shall meet biennially on the day before the start of the Championship and at the place of the Championship.

At a Biennial Meeting of the Council each Member Organization shall be entitled to be represented by one Delegate, who shall be a citizen or normally a resident of the country of the Member Organization and who shall be present at the Meeting in person. Appointment of Delegates shall be certified to the Secretary in advance.

Section 2. Quorum

Ten Member Organizations represented by Delegates present in person shall constitute a quorum at a Biennial Meeting of the Council.

Section 3. Action Without Meeting

Between Biennial Meetings, the Council may take action by mail vote on resolutions submitted to the Member Organizations by the Secretary pursuant to direction of the Administrative Committee.

Section 4. Majority Decision

A majority vote of the Delegates at a Biennial Meeting of the Council at which a quorum is present, or a majority vote of the Member Organizations in cases of action by mail, shall determine any question before the Council, subject to any additional requirements of other provisions of these Articles.

ARTICLE IX

Administrative Committee

Section 1. Composition

There shall be an Administrative Committee of eleven persons representing nine Member Organizations; three Member Organizations in each of the three respective Zones shall be represented. Each such person shall be a citizen or normally a resident of the country of the Member Organization he represents. If the country entertaining the next Championship is not represented in the Administrative Committee, it shall appoint a twelfth person to serve on the Committee in a non-voting capacity.

Section 2. Nomination; Election

(a) The Administrative Committee shall serve as
 a Nominating Committee and shall prospose to the

Biennial Meeting a slate of Member Organizations to receive the right to appoint one representative each to the Administrative Committee, Additional nominations may be made by Delegates to the Biennial Meeting.

- (b) At each Biennial Meeting seven Member Organizations shall be chosen, by ballot, to receive the right to appoint one representative each to the Administrative Committee, to serve for the ensuing two years. The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association shall be permanently entitled to appoint two representatives.
- (c) Each Member Organization so chosen shall promptly appoint its representative to the Administrative Committee and give the Secretary notification of the appointment. If a Delegate of any Member Organization so chosen is present at the Biennial Meeting, he shall thereupon become the appointee of his Member Organization to the Administrative Committee.
- (d) A Member Organization shall have the right to change its appointee to the Administrative Committee at its pleasure; any such change shall become effective when the Secretary receives notification thereof.

Section 3. Duties

The Administrative Committee shall conduct the affairs of the Council, subject to the provisions of these Articles and to directions of the Council.

Section 4. Meetings

The retiring Administrative Committee shall meet immediately prior to the Biennial Meeting of The Council.

The Administrative Committee newly determined at the Biennial Meeting of the Council shall meet immediately after the Biennial Meeting of the Council.

Section 5. Quorum

Three members present in person representing at least three Member Organizations shall constitute a quorum of the Administrative Committee.

Section 6. Action Between Meetings.

Between meetings, the Administrative Committee may take action by mail vote on resolutions submitted to the representatives to the Administrative Committee by the Secretary.

Section 7. Majority Decision

A majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present, or a majority vote of the entire Administrative Committee in case of action by mail, shall determine any question before the Administrative Committee.

ARTICLE X

Officers

Section 1. Titles; Election

(a) The officers of the Council shall be two Joint Chairmen who shall be representatives of The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association, and a Secretary. The

Joint Chairmen shall each be one of the representatives to the Administrative Committee. At each Biennial Meeting the Council shall determine by ballot the Member Organizations whose representatives to the Administrative Committee shall hold such respective offices for the ensuing two years. If any Member Organization concerned changes its representative to the Administrative Committee during such period, the successor shall assume the office concerned.

(b) The Secretary shall be appointed by the Administrative Committee.

Section 2. Chairman

One of the Joint Chairmen shall preside at meetings of the Council and of the Administrative Committee, and in general shall perform the customary duties of his office.

Section 3. Secretary

The Secretary shall keep the records of the Council and of the Administrative Committee, give notices of all meetings and conduct all votes by mail, carry on the correspondence of the Council, and perform all other customary duties of his office.

ARTICLE XI

Language

The official language of the Council is English.

ARTICLE XII

Care of Trophy

Section 1. Protection

The United States Golf Association shall retain title to the Championship Trophy, and shall make arrangements for its insurance and for its safekeeping during any suspension of the Championship.

Section 2. Dissolution of Council

In the event of dissolution of the Council, such use or other disposition of the Championship Trophy shall be made as The United States Golf Association may in its discretion determine.

ARTICLE XIII

Amendments

These articles may be amended by action of the Council, provided, however, that the provisions of these Articles with respect to the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status shall not be amended without the unamimous affirmative vote of the Member Organizations; that the provisions of these Articles with respect to permanent representation to the Administrative Committee and those with respect to the Joint Chairmen until the 1962 meeting shall not be amended without the affirmative votes of the respective Member Organizations concerned; and that the provisions of these Articles with respect to the ownership and custody of the Championship Trophy shall not be amended without the affirmative vote of The United States Golf Association; and provided further, that any amendment of these Articles increasing the monetary obligations of Member Organizations shall not be binding upon any Member Organization which voted against the amendment.

ARTICLE XIV

Women's Amateur Team Championship

Section 1. Regulations

The Council shall conduct biennially a Women's Amateur Team Championship for the Espirito Santo Trophy, open to Teams representing Member Organizations of the Women's Division.

All relevant provisions and principles of Articles IV, V, VI, VII and XII shall apply except as follows:

Each Team shall consist of two or three players. In each 18-hole round, the total of the two lowest scores by players of each Team shall constitute the Team score for that round.

Section 2. Place and Time

The place and the time of the Women's Amateur Team Championship shall be determined by the Council. The Championship shall be held as near as feasible geographically to the Men's Championship and in an adjacent week or concurrently but preferably before the Men's Championship.

Section 3. Prizes

The Espirito Santo Trophy, presented to the Council by the family of Ricardo Espirito Santo through the Portuguese Golf Federation, shall be held for the ensuing biennium by the Member Organization whose Team is the winner.

In the event of abandonment of the Women's Amateur Team Championship, such use or other disposition of the Espirito Santo Trophy shall be made as the Portuguese Golf Federation may in it discretion determine.

ARTICLE XV

Women's Division

All relevant provisions and principles of the Articles shall apply to the Women's Division except as follows:

Section 1. Membership

Membership in the Women's Division is open to any organization which either:

(a) Is a Member Organization of the Council and has jurisdiction of women's amateur golf in its country. An application from a Member Organization of the Council for membership in the Women's Division shall be granted automatically.

-- OR ---

(b) Constitutes the sole central authority for women's amateur golf in its country and has adopted the Rules of Amateur status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, or The United States Golf Association. An application from such an organization shall be supported by copies of the applicant's constitution and by-laws or similar documents and such data as the Administrative Committee determines. Such an applicant may be elected by the Council after determination by the Administrative Committee that the requirements for membership have been met.

Section 2. Finances

The principles of Article III, Section 3, shall apply

to Women's Division Members to defray all Council expenses relating to avomen's events.

Section 3. Biennial Meeting

The Women's Division shall meet biennially two days before the start of the Women's Amateur Team Championship and at the place of the Championship.

At a Biennial Meeting each Member Organization of the Women's Division shall be entitled to be represented by one Delegate, who shall be present in person and whose appointment shall be certified to the Secretary in advance.

Eight Member Organizations of the Women's Division represented by Delegates present in person shall constitute a quorum at a Biennial Meeting.

Section 4. Women's Committee; Chairman

There shall be a Women's Committee of nine persons representing nine Member Organizations of the Women's Division, three from each of the three respective Zones. At each Biennial Meeting there shall be chosen by ballot the nine Member Organizations which shall be entitled to appoint representatives to the Women's Committee, to serve for the ensuing two years.

One of these nine Member Organizations shall be chosen by ballot to receive the right to have its representative serve as Chairman of the Women's Division and the Women's Committee.

Section 5. Duties of Women's Committee

The Women's Committee shall conduct the affairs of the Women's Division, subject to directions of the Council, and shall advise the Council on matters relative to the Women's Amateur Team Championship. Matters of policy shall be determined by the Council.

ARTICLE XVI

Senior Amateur Team Championship

Section 1. General

The Council shall conduct a Senior Amateur Team Championship, open to Teams respresenting the Member Organizations.

Competitors shall be at least 55 years of age on the first day of the Championship.

All relevant provisions and principles of Articles IV, V, VI, VII and XII shall apply except as follows.

Section 2. Time

The Championship shall be conducted biennially in the Autumn, in alternate years from the Men's and Women's Championships. Specific dates should be subject to approval of the Administrative Committee.

Section 3. Place

- (a) Each Member Organization will be invited to send a Delegate to a meeting to be held during the Senior Championship to consider invitations to entertain the next Senior Championship. The recommendation of the Delegates of this meeting shall be subject to approval of the Administrative Committee.
- (b) Invitations to entertain the Senior Championship shall be submitted by Member Organizations to

the Secretary at least three months in advance of the meeting of delegates.

Section 4. Form of Play

- (a) Each Team shall consist of four players.
- (b) The Championship shall consist of a 36-hole stroke play qualifying competition over two days, 18 holes on the first Championship day and 18 holes on the second Championship day, followed by two rounds of match play over two days in flights of 4.
- (c) In each 18-hole qualifying round, the total of the three lowest scores by players of a Team shall constitute the Team's score for that round. The total of a Team's three-player scores for the two rounds shall be the Team's qualifying score.
- (d) Teams shall be placed in flights for match play according to qualifying scores, with the four lowest-scoring Teams comprising the Championship Flight, the Teams in positions 5 through 8 comprising the Second Flight, and so on.
- (e) In event of a tie for last place in the Championship Flight, there shall be a sudden-death play-off among all players of the tied Teams, with the three lowest scores by players of a Team constituting the Team's score for a hole. A tie for last place in any other flight shall be decided by lot.
- (f) In each flight, Teams shall be number 1 through 4 based on qualifying scores. In event of a tie, Team numbers shall be decided by lot. In the first round of match play Team No. 1 shall play Team No. 3 and Team No. 2 shall play Team No. 4. In the second round of match play, the first-round winners shall play for the first place and the first-round losers shall play for third place. Prizes shall be awarded to each member of the first, second and third place Teams in each flight.
- (g) The winner of a match shall be determined as follows: Prior to each match, each Team Captain shall present to the Committee by a specfied time his Team's line-up, i.e., a list of his players numbered 1 through 4. The No. 1 players of two opposing Teams shall play an 18-hole match for one point, the No. 2 players shall play for a point, and so on. In event of a tied match, each player shall be awarded ½ point. The team with the most points shall be the winner.
- (h) In event of a tie between two opposing Teams in the Championship Flight, there shall be a suddendeath play-off among all players of both teams, i.e., the first Team "up" after a hole shall be the winner. For example, if the No. 1 player of Team A wins the first extra hole from the No. 1 player of Team B, the No. 2 player of Team B, wins the first extra hole from the No. 2 player of Team A, the No. 3 player of Team A wins the first extra hole from the No. 3 player of Team A wins the first extra hole from the No. 3

player of Team B and the No. 4 players of the two teams halve the first extra hole. Team A would be the winner. Ties in other (lights shall be decided on a margin-of-victory basis. If the opposing Teams are a sudden-death play-off as in the Championship Flight. The winner on a margin-of-victory basis is the Team with the highest figure when the margin-of-victory figures of its winning players are totaled. For example, if players No. 1 and 3 of Team A win by 4-2 and 2-1 and players No. 2 and 4 of Team B win by 3-2 and 2-1, Team A would be the winner as the total of its margin-of-victory figures is 9 (4+2+2+1) compared with B (3+2+2+1) for Team B.

- (i) All matches in a given flight will tee off in immediate succession. If necessary, play shall be in groups of four, i.e., the No. 1 players of two opposing Teams would play their match concurrently with the No. 2 players of the same Teams. They would be followed immediately by the No. 3 and 4 players of the same Teams.
- (j) If the total number of Teams entered is divisible by 4, each flight shall comprise four Teams. If the total is not divisible by 4, the following schedule will be used. In flights of less than four Teams bye(s) shall be used for the last place(s):

Section 5. Prizes

The Shun Nomura Trophy, presented to the Council by friends of golf in Japan through the Japan Golf Association, shall be held for the ensuing biennium by the Member Organization whose Team is the winner.

In the event of abandonment of the Senior Amateur Team Championship, such use or other disposition of the Shun Nomura Trophy shall be made as the Japan Golf Association may in its discretion determine
